## Councillor kicked out of meeting

Corner Brook mayor orders council member removed during heated exchange

**CORNER BROOK** — A discussion on a new code of conduct for Corner Brook city council became heated on Monday, March 13, as the mayor ordered Mayor Jim Ferraro ordered Councillor Charles Pender from the meeting.

At its Feb. 27 meeting, council rejected a proposed code of conduct, and by doing so failed to meet the provincial government's March 1 deadline to have one put in place.

At the same meeting, council approved a similar code of conduct for staff.

When the matter came up for discussion again on Monday, Ferraro said the council had three options:

1. Outline issues with the code that was delivered for staff to make changes and council to consider an amended version at a later date.

2. The same code could be brought back again but would require a motion for council to reconsider it.

3. Have changes made to the template provided by the province to make it compliant with the City of Corner Brook Act and vote on that.

Pender made a motion that the city adopt the provincial template with some changes and outlined them for council.

"When the mayor asked why council shouldn't use the draft brought forward, Pender said he didn't agree with it including the media policy, the fact council was not consulted before it was brought forward and a motion on using city property during a election."

As the debate continued, Pender agreed to provide his notes to the clerk to have it compiled in a document for council to review and to bring the matter back at the next meeting.

### EMAIL, NOT A SAFE SPACE

Things went off the rails, however, when Pender accused someone about not responding to things sent to him via email by council.
